

Puffy Paint Moon

Materials:

1 Cup of shaving cream, ½ cup of (PVA) glue, paper plate, black liquid watercolor paint or food coloring, and large brushes.

Instructions:

- 1) Mix the above ingredients in a medium sized bowl to create the puffy paint. Add as much black as you need to make your moon gray.
- 2) Have the child use large brushes to paint the puffy paint onto the paper plate surface.
- 3) Once the plate is covered, have the child dip their fingers into the puffy paint to make craters.
- 4) Set aside to dry.

Lesson Variations:

- Add some glitter to your puffy paint mixture to make your art sparkle!

Look: Check out the moon in your night sky and if you have binoculars, look at the moon through them so you can see the craters on the moon.
